» About Your Host « FOREST COUNTY POTAWATOMI

The Forest County Potawatomi Community (FCPC) — Bodwéwadmí, Keepers of the Fire, are one of 12 federally-recognized bands of Potawatomi in the U.S. and Canada. The FCPC Reservation is based in Blackwell, Carter and Crandon, Wis., with over 1,800 enrolled tribal members who reside in and out of the United States.

Following the Treaty of Chicago in 1833, the government forcefully relocated thousands of Potawatomi to Kansas and Oklahoma. At this time, small groups and families

broke away from the main Potawatomi tribe to seek refuge in the dense forests of North Central Wisconsin. In 1913, treaty lands were recognized by the federal government as a reservation. FCPC settled down on new land in northeastern Wisconsin.

Throughout the 20th century, the community strengthened its governance, preserved cultural traditions, and pursued economic development. Investments such as the Potawatomi Casino Hotel in Milwaukee and other enterprises have

supported health services, education, environmental stewardship, and cultural-revitalization programs. As the largest employer in Forest County, Wisconsin, FCPC employs over 4,000 in both Forest County and Milwaukee.

Today, the Forest County Potawatomi are known for:

- Strong environmental protection efforts
- Language and cultural preservation
- Sustainable resource management of reservation lands
- Active involvement in tribal sovereignty and self-

determination

The Forest County Potawatomi Community Foundation plays a vital role in the tribe, consistently supporting charities, organizations, and schools that strengthens the county's vitality, along with many other Wisconsin counties, and enhance the overall quality of life.

By working together with the community, everyone can strive to achieve goals and a better understanding for each other.

Post 1 VETERANS

FCP Veterans Post 1 was established on July 28, 1988, after FCPC Resolution No.022-98 was passed. The group was started at the request of tribal leadership and local veterans and consists of members from the Forest County Potawatomi Community (FCPC). Their mission is to identify and address issues that impact FCP veterans, their dependents and their survivors. The Post recommends veterans programs, agendas, and projects that promote positive public awareness of the FCPC; and develop and encourages sponsorship of FCPC activities including working with youth, elder, incarcerated, and housebound individuals. Post 1 Veterans also regularly participate in community functions, color guard details, funerals, memorials, and other ceremonial events.

Members of Post 1 Veterans share a long and proud history of military service, dating back to the earliest conflicts in which Native Americans served this country, continuing through World War I, World War II, Korea,

Vietnam, and into modern-day service branches and deployments. Through their dedication, Post 1 Veterans honor those who have served before them while educating future generations about the sacrifices made by Native American service members. Other fun facts about Post 1 include:

- 72 FCP enrolled member veterans on record
- 27 current veteran members
- 66 total male veterans
- 6 women veterans including Julia (Nashanany) Reeves U.S. Army 1st Lt. — highest ranking FCPC tribal member veteran
- Oldest FCPC veteran found on record is Edward Tawah, born in 1913

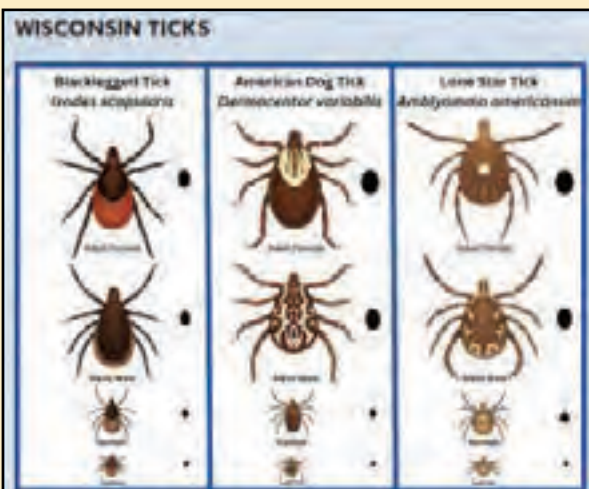


HEALTH TIPS

Wisconsin summers can bring the heat - and the humidity! Here are a few tips to help you stay cool and comfortable during the event:

- **Stay hydrated:** Watering stations are available throughout the event. Be sure to drink plenty of water, especially on humid days when your body loses fluids more quickly.
- **Cool off:** A cooling station is located at We Care, and use your cooling towel provided in your tote bag.
- **Bug awareness:** With warm weather and humidity come mosquitoes and other insects. We recommend applying insect repellent regularly, especially in the early morning and evening hours. Long sleeves and pants can also help protect against bites.

****If you are allergic to bees and are stung, use your epi-pen, call 911, and then find the nearest first aid station.****



Note: the oval or dot next to each tick image represents their actual size.

Blacklegged or deer ticks can spread Lyme disease, babesiosis, anaplasmosis, ehrlichiosis, and Powassan virus. These ticks are found throughout Wisconsin.

Lone star ticks can spread ehrlichiosis. These ticks are rare in Wisconsin. A bite from this tick has also been associated with the development of alpha-gal syndrome (or red meat allergy) in some people.

American dog ticks or Wood ticks can spread Rocky Mountain spotted fever and tularemia. These ticks are common throughout Wisconsin, but very rarely spread disease in our state.

TICK BITES CAN MAKE YOU SICK

+ Symptoms of illnesses spread by ticks can range from mild to severe. They can include fever, chills, sweats, rash, muscle aches, joint pain, headache, fatigue, nausea, and vomiting.

+ It is important to treat illnesses spread by ticks early.

Talk to your doctor if you have any of the symptoms above within 30 days of a possible tick bite.

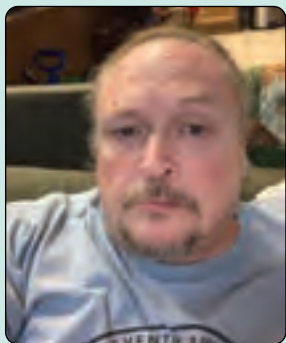
» BSMETHWEN (KYLE MALOTT) «

I lived there for 4 years as I was taught by fluent Potawatomi speakers, then I moved back to Pokagon Band. At this time I teach my fellow Potawatomi people to speak Potawatomi.

I plan on talking about different ways that we can describe land and how those words work.

Frank Barker, Eagle Clan, is a citizen of the Match-E-Be-Nash-She-Wish Band of Pottawatomis, also known as the Gun Lake

Tribe, and a proud resident of the Bradley Indian Settlement, in Bradley, Michigan.

He is currently the Language Coordinator for the Gun Lake Tribe, after a 22-year career in education. Frank has been a lifelong learner of our language and will share a few hands-on learning strategies that have worked for him.

Bozho, jayék! Zhawnokwé ndezhnekas.

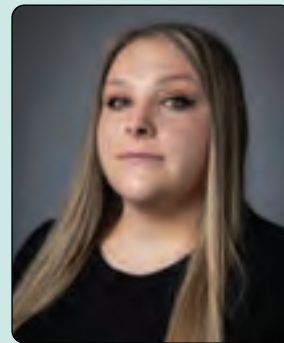
I'm Lindsay Jones Marean, and I've been active in learning our language and helping to carry it forward for a couple of decades. Over the years I've learned some linguistics, helped publish the "Forest County Potawatomi Dictionary" and some collections of stories, helped with the final edits on the Prairie Band Potawatomi grammar book, and boosted my Neshnabémwen comprehension thanks to the Nishnaabemwin Pane immersion program. Currently I facilitate a weekly online Potawatomi language study group.

Do you ever notice pairs like this: *nnaden* 'I fetch it', *najgadé* 'it is fetched', with a "d" in the first word and "j" in the second word?

Do you ever wonder why there's a "t" *pitse* 'he/she is a certain age' but a "ch" in *Ni je épich-bozyen* 'How fast are you driving'?

Why is there an "n" in *nmina* 'I give something to him/her' but an "sh" in *mishen* 'give it to me!'?

When t changes to ch, d changes to j, s changes to sh, or z changes to zh, we call that palatalization. In Neshnabémwen, we also use that term when d changes to z, and even when n changes to sh or zh! In this talk, we'll look at examples of these sound pairs and see how they can help us understand words and put sentences together. We'll also discuss historical reasons for these sound pairs in Potawatomi today.

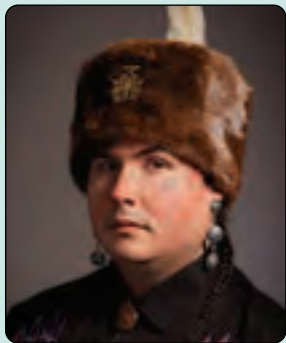

Corinne Kasper (Nenweshkwe) is a member of the Pokagon Band of Potawatomi Indians, currently serving as the tribal linguist for Ethe Bodwëwadmiw, and going into the second year of a Post-Doc at the University of Chicago in the department of linguistics. She has been learning Potawatomi since she was 12 years old and will continue to learn for the rest of her life.

Currently, I serve as the Interdepartmental Bodëwadmiw Lead, working with the Citizen Potawatomi Nation Child Development Centers, JOM Program, and various departments, including Education, Employee Advocacy, Workforce Development, and the Cultural Heritage Center.

In my role, I design and implement in-class and online language curriculum and programs for children aged 1 to 12 at our Child Development Centers. Additionally, I assist in developing community-based initiatives through our administrative departments and Cultural Heritage Center. This unique opportunity allows me to combine our community's ideals and knowledge with education and enrichment.

To expand the reach of Bodëwadmiw beyond our community borders, I administer online collegiate courses (Potawatomi I and II) to six colleges and universities, with Potawatomi III currently in development. The coursework is designed not only for language instruction but also to enhance the understanding and appreciation of our traditions, beliefs, and the Bodëwadmi way of life.

For the past seven years, I have studied the Potawatomi language under many of our knowledge keepers and speakers throughout the Potawatomi Nation. My passion drives me to keep our cultural heritage vibrant. My work ensures that our culture is taught to interested learners and preserved for future generations. My mission in life is to uplift our community members and inspire both young and old Bodëwadmi. I aim to encourage the learning, use, and preservation of Bodëwadmiw, fostering a personal connection with our ancestry and ensuring that the spirit of our people remains vibrant.

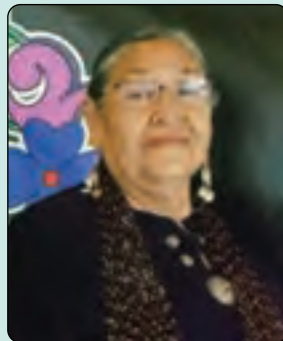
Topic: kyènēp & wigfo (Speed & Trash)

Hello, my name is Brennah (Wahweotten) Simon. I am Prairie Band Potawatomi and work for the Prairie Band Potawatomi Nation Language Department. I've been working as a Language Apprentice I since July of 2022. My job is focused on working with children ages 0-5 and all other duties assigned within the department. I feel as though my specialty is teaching language through play with children.

Bošho, My name is Nomkiwash Potts, I'm Prairie Band Potawatomi and I work in the Prairie Band Potawatomi Language Department as a Apprentice 2. I've worked within the language department a little over 5 years. I help our language teachers and apprentice 1's create learning material for whatever class or event we have going on at that time.

Playing card games in tribal languages is an effective, interactive method for acquiring vocabulary and a few cultural nuances. Playing card games also supports growth in social skills and cognitive strategies. It creates a low-pressure, high-repetition environment that enhances retention and encourages spontaneous language use. Playing card games in Potawatomi has been a fun and effective method when learning in the office as a language employee, with the youth in classroom settings, and in the home as well.

Active Listening: Learners must fully concentrate on understanding, responding, and remembering what is being said, rather than passive listening.

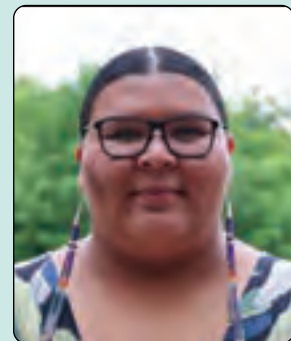
Developing Visualization Skills: Learners must visualize, hold, and manipulate mental images before expressing them on paper.

Build Spatial Reasoning: Learners build their understanding of spatial relationships (e.g., "above", "below", "next to", "behind", etc.) by translating verbal descriptions into physical drawings.

Enhance Vocabulary and Descriptive

Language: Learners are encouraged to use descriptive language to describe shapes, sizes, and relative positions.

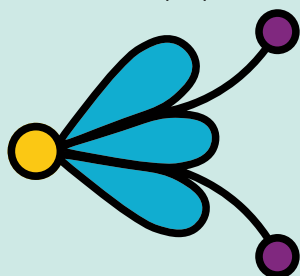

I began learning Bodwéwadmimwen through community classes and language workshops. After a year or so, Kyle Malott and myself stepped into independent contractor language positions. We apprenticed under Jim Thunder from 2013-2017 and Mary Jane Thunder 2013-2015, both Forest County Potawatomi speakers. Upon completion of the apprenticeship, we continued to work with Jim in person and on zoom until 2022.

Language work is important to me because I am a Potawatomi person. I was blessed by the creator in that I was born Neshnabé. It is my responsibility to provide for our future as a whole, in the best way that I can. We were gifted our language. We can still see how our relatives viewed and appreciated the world through this language. The language keeps us grounded to the earth and what she provides. It helps us see and hear what is above us and to know what is below us. It makes us open our ears and eyes to more than what is only in front of us. When our eyes are open, we can live in a better way. In the way that was meant our people to live.

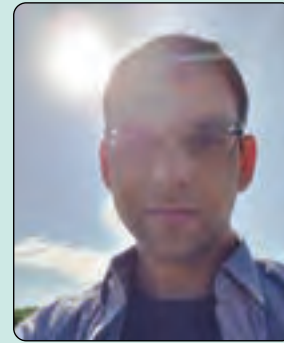

Teaching Proficiency Through Reading and Story Telling is a widely used teaching method for acquiring a second-language through repetitive, comprehensible story telling. This method was brought to Potawatomi country by Zhawnokwe. In this presentation, we will put TPRS to work for a short Potawatomi story by presenting a line of the story, asking a few short reflection questions about the story, and circling back through the story before moving on to a new line.

Dokmegizhek is a part of the loon clan. He is an enrolled member of the Citizen Potawatomi Nation. He graduated with his PhD in Linguistics in 2020. He lives in Silver Lake, KS. He works for Prairie Band Potawatomi Nation (PBPB)'s Language and Culture Department where his job title is Curriculum and Instruction Manager. This presentation does not necessarily express the views of the PBPB. Dokmegizhek has taken the day off to present this presentation.

By the end of the presentation, attendees will be able to:

- Identify vocabulary and grammar from the presented story
- Identify question words and questions forms of sentences
- Respond with basic answers to questions, and
- Retell the basic story line of the presented story.
